HOUSE NUMBERS

All houses in the Village should have numbers which are clearly visible from the road. In the event of an emergency the Fire and Police Departments need your cooperation so they can respond as quickly as possible.

STORM WATER

Storm water is the runoff from storm events or spring melt. Storm water runoff needs to be treated because it carries litter, oil, gasoline, fertilizers, pesticides, pet wastes, sediments, and anything else that can float, dissolve, or be swept along by the moving water. Left untreated, polluted storm water can reach nearby waterways where it can harm and even kill aquatic life. It can also pollute groundwater so always sweep up litter and debris from walkways and sidewalks, driveways, patios and especially around storm drains.

As springtime approaches, here are some other steps you can take at home:

Auto Care: Oils, grease, and cleaning fluids can kill aquatic life.

- Wash cars on lawn or gravel surface with an environmentally friendly cleaner, or use a commercial car wash that treats or recycles its wastewater.
- Use drip pans to collect auto fluids and fix leaks promptly
- Clean up spills with dry absorbent materials such as kitty litter.
- Dispose of oil and grease properly.

Pet Waste: Is a major source of bacteria that can result in the spread of disease.

- Don't leave pet waste on the ground. Scoop it, bag it, and throw it in the trash.

Yard Care: Fertilizer promotes algae growth that can kill fish and wildlife, and contaminate groundwater.

- Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly, or just use compost instead.
- Keep chemicals off paved surfaces. Sweep up spills.
- Mow at proper height to reduce fertilizer.
- Improve your soil and conserve water by using compost and mulch.

Landscaping: Help the rain soak into the ground.

- Direct roof and driveway runoff to a lawn or area with plantings.

Remember to keep everything out of storm water systems except the rainwater they are designed to collect.

The projects we've accomplished over the last few years, due to the generous donations of the residents, have included instituting the Winter Festival in the Commons now run by the Chamber of Commerce, the Holiday Decorating Contest, decorating the bridge with wreaths, purchasing the tulips that were planted throughout the Village and most recently, the fall décor you saw in the Commons and at the bridge.

With Grant money received by the Village, we also participated in the street sign design and the traffic calming islands at 'the stands' at the west end of town.

Some of the plans for the future are to extend the wreaths from the bridge into the Village during the holidays, and year round - as well as seasonal landscape plantings in the Village. Once the new streetscape design is finished, a plan will be developed to create a more cohesive look to the storefronts in town.

Permits must be obtained prior to having garage/yard sales or estate sales. Signs advertising sales cannot be affixed to poles, streetsigns, etc. This is a Nassau County Law carrying a \$350.00 fine. Signs should not be placed in the Adopt-A-Spots

SIDEWALKS

Hopefully the snow has left us for the season but just in case it hasn't – please remember that sidewalks do have to be shoveled within 12 hours of a snowfall. This winter warnings were given, complaints were received and summonses were issued. Snow from the sidewalks SHOULD NOT be thrown into the roadway when shoveling.
